

Dear Raspberry Families,

Hope this email finds you well. Here is your weekly water system update. Don't hesitate to contact me or Todd with questions or suggestions.

SUMMARY/CATCH UP

Twice weekly coliform bacteria monitoring of the water entering the distribution system (the water you actually drink) continues to show non-detectable results, meaning it's clear of bacteria. As a safety precaution, we have calculated the minimum storage tank level needed to provide sufficient contact time for 99.99% inactivation of viruses. We are operating the tank at levels significantly above that level. Though we don't yet have reason to believe that Giardia is present in the water, the minimum tank level set also provides 99.9% inactivation of Giardia at current usage patterns. The attached graphs show the data.

INVESTIGATION OF SURFACE WATER INFLUENCE

Monday, June 2, was two weeks from the last storm event of >0.5" of rain. Daily coliform bacteria analyses are being performed to tell us when we can perform our MPA (microscopic particulate analysis) tests (to check for contaminants such as Giardia and Cryptosporidium). With the rain we received yesterday, we can not perform the dry weather MPA first, so we will perform the wet weather MPA first instead. EXPLORATION OF OTHER OPTIONS

RESERVE WELL

Our hydrogeologic consultant is performing initial evaluations to determine its suitability.

TRADE WITH GOLF WELL

Well completion reports are being collected for the golf course wells. We've opened discussions regarding their suitability with the state and local health departments.

ADVANCED TREATMENT OF WELL 1

We have no news to report on this option at this time.

DRILL A NEW WELL

We have no news to report on this option at this time.

QUANTITY UPDATE

Demand was okay this week. Last week you'll recall there was a slight increase over the previous week, but at closer inspection, it averaged to only an additional 50 gallons per home. That's more like an extra load of laundry or a couple of extra 10-minute showers as opposed to more lawn watering as I had indicated in

my email to you. Sorry about that. I should have scrutinized the numbers more closely, and I will be sure to do that from this point forward.
