Dear Resident,

On March 10, 2011, Loudoun Water was officially informed by the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) that Well RSP-F (also known as Well F) is approved for development as a community water supply well. In addition, on March 11, 2011, Loudoun Water received a waterworks construction permit from VDH. This permit allows us to complete work on the project to replace Well PW-1 with Well F.

Because of these developments, the construction work necessary to bring Well F online and make it part of the Raspberry Falls water system will begin this week. We anticipate that Well F will be placed into operation by May 31, 2011.

Because PW-2 is the only well serving Raspberry Falls during the first part of spring, we are asking that you voluntarily follow the same water conservation recommendations we give to all of our central system customers. We ask our central system customers to water their lawns and plants on a two-day-a-week schedule based on their house numbers; odd addresses, Wednesday and Saturday, even addresses, Thursday and Sunday. We also ask them not to water between 10am and 4pm to avoid wasting water. Adhering to this schedule will help manage elevated demands in the community throughout the summer peak period.

Loudoun Water is continuing with the studies requested by its board of directors to prepare facility plans for the purpose of evaluating the following measures: 1) a water treatment plant for all potable water wells serving Raspberry Falls; 2) a water treatment plant for all potable wells serving Selma Estates; and 3) a water treatment plant for all potable wells serving Raspberry Falls and Selma Estates.

In addition, we are working with other local government entities to fulfill a Loudoun County Board of Supervisors request to study a pipeline extension of Town of Leesburg water to Raspberry Falls.
